Preparation for Worship

As you enter the Sanctuary, please prepare your heart for worship and silence your mobile devices.

Corporate worship serves as a spiritual conversation between our heavenly Lord and us. James reminds us of what is supposed to happen when we gather for worship: "Draw near to God and he will draw near to you" (4:8).

Those who lead us in worship are tasked with facilitating this conversation between God and His people. This dialogical framework permeates our services: God speaks to us and we respond to Him. Sometimes our leaders speak for God to us and, other times, they speak to God for us.

Let us prepare our hearts to meet with the One who delights to be called our friend. John Owen offers us this simple prayer to guide us: "Christ is our best friend now, and, before long, He will be our only friend... Therefore, I pray to God with all my heart that I may be weary of everything else but to converse and commune with Him."

This is a most fitting prayer for us as we resume our sermon series through the book of Colossians where the Apostle Paul draws out the practical implications of our union with Christ by faith. Let us prepare our hearts to worship God.

All those who have publicly professed their faith and joined a Christian church as a communing member are warmly welcomed to receive communion today. At Second Presbyterian, we encourage our children not to take communion until they have joined the church as communicant members.

We do, however, encourage non-communing children to come forward with their parents to receive a blessing. Those wishing to be served communion together as a group or family, please stand together in front of the two serving elders before taking the elements.

Gluten-free communion bread is available upon request from the elder at the east side of the transverse aisle (opposite from the door leading to the Connector).
