

Embroidered upon the purple Pulpit Fall in gold thread are the Greek letters Chi and Rho, the first two letters of the Greek word XPICTOC, Christos, together with the letters Alpha and Omega, the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, representing Christ, the beginning of all things and the end. The Chi Rho symbols are a Christogram, or monogram, as it were, of Christ. On the two Bible Markers, in the same gold thread, the letter Alpha is on one side and Omega on the other.
