We consider it a privilege to have our children in worship with us. If your small children become restless and vocal, we invite you to the children's room especially designed for them at the rear of the Sanctuary. They are also welcome in the nursery. Paraments: The paraments in the Sanctuary today have been changed from the purple cloths used during the season of Lent to a deep, rich red in observance of World Missions Sunday. The pulpit scarf is adorned with large, burning flames embroidered in three shades of gold thread, outlined with gold metallic stitches, signifying the coming of the Holy Spirit to the disciples to give them power to take the Gospel to the world. The flames represent the "tongues of fire" which came to rest upon each of them. Three leaping flames are sewn in gold upon each Bible marker on the lectern. Red paraments are often used for special occasions in church life, including missions.

Timothy Keller

Timothy Keller is the founding pastor of Redeemer Presbyterian Church in Manhattan, which he started in 1989 with his wife, Kathy, and three young sons. For over twenty years he has led a diverse congregation of young professionals that has grown to a weekly attendance of over 5,000.

Keller is also President of Redeemer City to City, which starts new churches in New York and other global cities, and publishes books and resources for faith in an urban culture. In over ten years they have helped to launch over 200 churches in 35 cities. Keller's books include the New York Times bestselling *The Reason for God* and *The Prodigal God*.
