A follow-up event will be held tomorrow at 6:15 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall at IPC. Lennox will speak at a breakfast on the topic "God: Fact or Fiction. Is Revelation Reliable?" Breakfast will be served, and tickets will be available at the door.

A final lecture will be given at the Garrett Auditorium at Baptist Memorial Hospital East at noon tomorrow on the topic "The God Particle: Has Physics Made God Unnecessary?" No ticket is needed.
