A Word on Worship

During Advent, we sing about and study the incarnation of Jesus Christ. II Corinthians 8:9 serves as a key text for our understanding:

"For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich."

J.I. Packer, in his spiritual classic, Knowing God, writes:

This verse states not only the fact of the incarnation but also its meaning. The taking of manhood by the Son is not only a marvel of nature, but a wonder of grace. The Lord of everything becomes a servant so that we might receive God's grace. What is grace? It is undeserved favor from an unobligated giver.

This grace not only saves us for all eternity, but revolutionizes our lives now. E. Stanley Jones, a missionary to India, summarizes:

"Grace binds you with far stronger cords than the cords of duty or obligation can bind you. Grace is free, but when once you take it, you are bound forever to the Giver and bound to catch the spirit of the Giver. Like produces like. Grace makes you gracious, the Giver makes you give."

As we worship today, may God's grace and generosity lavished on us at Jesus' cradle, cross, and empty tomb transform us into His gracious and generous people.

This anonymous text first appeared in a New England Hymnal in 1784 and has long been used as an Advent hymn. The text alludes to Song of Solomon 2:3 — "and His fruit was sweet to my taste." Charles Spurgeon says, "Jesus yields fruit, let us taste the sweetness of it. If Jesus is as an apple tree among the trees of the woods, do not keep away from Him, but sit under His shadow, and taste His fruit."

The tree of life my soul hath seen, laden with fruit and always green; The trees of nature fruitless be, compared with Christ the apple tree.

This beauty doth all things excel, by faith I know, but ne'er can tell The glory which I now can see, in Jesus Christ the apple tree.

For happiness I long have sought, and pleasure dearly I have bought; I missed of all, but now I see 'tis found in Christ the apple tree.

This fruit doth make my soul to thrive, it keeps my dying faith alive; Which makes my soul in haste to be with Jesus Christ the apple tree.
