A Word on Worship

As you enter the Sanctuary, please prepare your heart for worship and silence your mobile devices.

Corporate worship serves as a spiritual conversation between our heavenly Lord and us. James reminds us of what is supposed to happen when we gather for worship: "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you" (James 4:8).

Those who lead us in worship are tasked with facilitating this conversation between God and His people. This dialogical framework permeates our services: God speaks to us, and we respond to Him. Sometimes our leaders speak for God to us and, other times, they speak for us to God.

Let us prepare our hearts to meet with the One who delights to be called our friend. John Owen offers us this simple prayer to guide us: "Christ is our best friend now, and, before long, He will be our only friend... Therefore, I pray God with all my heart that I may be weary of everything else but converse and communion with Him."
