Today is Worldwide Communion Sunday. Christians in every culture break the bread and pour the cup to remember Christ's death. We also affirm that He alone is the Lord and Head of His Church. Whether the Lord's Supper is shared in a grand sanctuary, a mud hut, outside on a hilltop, or in a storefront, this meal teaches us that "we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" (I Corinthians 10:17).

During communion, we not only take time to look back and reflect on our crucified Savior's love, but we also look ahead and anticipate a coming Savior's glory. This frees us from despair as we face hostility, adversity, and heartache.

Participating in the Lord's Supper should awaken in us a longing for another feast — the ultimate feast, when our Lord will make all things new. He will swallow up death forever. He will wipe away tears from all faces, and we will forever rejoice in our Lord's salvation.

Let us praise the Lord as we accept His invitation to feast upon His Word and at His table!



INVITATION TO THE TABLE

This is the Lord's table. All who profess their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ are invited to receive communion. If this is not your faith, we would still encourage you to walk forward, knowing that no one will make you take the elements. Any of our elders or pastors will be happy to talk to you about questions or doubts you have about faith in Christ. We encourage children not to take communion until they have joined the church but do welcome them to come forward with their parents to receive a blessing. If you are unable to come forward, please raise your hand and an elder will serve you in your seat.

For those in the balcony, please remain seated, and the elements will be served to you in your pew. All communion wafers are gluten free.
