PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

As you enter the Sanctuary, please prepare your heart for worship and silence your mobile devices.

The theme for our worship service today is the faithfulness of God. Thus, our opening song is the beloved hymn, "Great Is Thy Faithfulness."

Lamentations 3:22-23, which also serves as this morning's Assurance of Divine Pardon passage, inspired Thomas Obediah Chisholm to write this hymn in 1923. His purpose was to convey the sense of wonder and gratefulness all Christians should have toward God's faithfulness.

Chisholm himself, though he experienced ill health and poverty most of his adult life, possessed such wonder and gratefulness. At age 75, he wrote in a letter, "My income has not been large at any time due to impaired health in the earlier years which has followed me on until now. Although I must not fail to record here the unfailing faithfulness of a covenant-keeping God and that He has given me many wonderful displays of His providing care, for which I am filled with astonishing gratefulness."

As all three verses indicate, God is always faithful to His people in Christ. We need not look any further than His Word (verse 1), creation (verse 2), and our lives (verse 3) to see His great faithfulness on display.

Whatever challenges, trials, or disappointments we might be facing this morning, we are reminded in this hymn that God's promises are true, that He never changes, and that His compassion never fails.

Let us then worship our faithful God together!

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
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
