International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church

Today we join Christians around the world in observing the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church. When sisters and brothers who face all manner of suffering because of their belief in Christ are asked how we who worship freely can help them, their first response is, "Pray for us!"

- Pray for courage, strength, and protection for those imprisoned for their faith.
- Pray for holy boldness and gracious witness even to their persecutors.
- Pray also for assurance of God's presence and provision for those who have lost homes, livelihoods, and family members.
- Finally, pray that Christians in free nations will begin to understand "the fellowship of suffering" (Philippians 3:10) and choose to stand with and support our persecuted brothers and sisters.
