One by One's mission is to impact an entire generation by enriching the quality of life for babies and their parents through God's Word. 2PC Women's Ministry Department facilitates involvement with the ministry by connecting an expectant teen with a mentor (2PC member). The mentors provide spiritual support as well as prenatal support. Hickory Hill, Alcy Ball, and Frayser Community are some of the communities that are served by the ministry.

PRAYER PARTNERS Each mentor is assigned a prayer partner who studies the same Bible studies that the mentor does. The prayer partner prays constantly with the mentor—including by phone and in person. The commitment is from the prenatal months through the first year of a baby's life, an average of about 18 months.

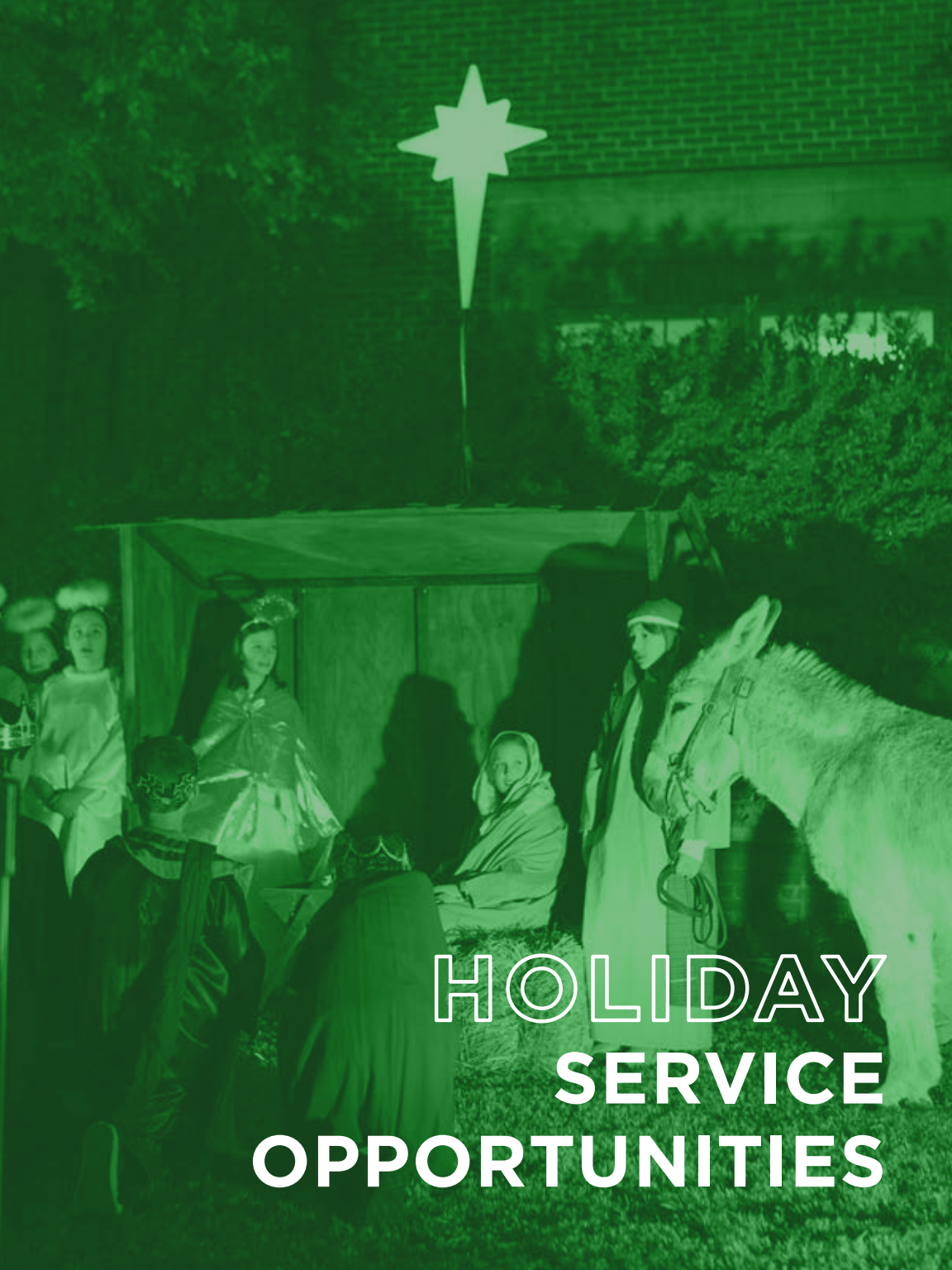
